### JUSTIN THANKS GOD FOR YOU

YOU HELPED HIM SEE GOD'S PLAN IN TIMES OF TRIAL

Justin never thought we'd be sharing his story in the *Mission Messenger*.

A few years ago, Justin and his wife had just relocated to Texas for Justin's job and they were settling into a new routine with much hope on the horizon. Then COVID hit.

"My wife was high risk with asthma, so we tried to play it safe," Justin remembers. Thankfully, Justin's wife remained in good physical health during the pandemic. But over the course

of the next year, her mental health began to suffer.

"I'd been married to this woman for 10 years; the love of my life. I know her," Justin shares. "And I watched her turn into someone that wasn't her."

"Her mood became erratic, and she refused to see a doctor," Justin shares. "She would get into screaming matches with others. One day, she called me after taking the car and said she never wanted to see me again."

### "I watched her mental state and my whole life deteriorate," Justin expresses.

Having grown up in Marion, Justin moved back to be near family. He was getting by on money he saved, but it was running out. "I googled 'homeless shelter,' and I found this place," Justin says.

On his first day at Grant County Rescue Mission, Justin walked to Family Dollar to get a few items and recognized the guy stocking shelves. It was a friend from childhood who also ran the store. Justin shared his story, and his friend gave him a job on the spot.

Justin knew it wasn't coincidence.

With a new job and

a place to eat and rest,

Justin tried to make sense of his marriage, all the while working hard and serving at the mission. People encouraged him to file for divorce, but in his

heart, he

couldn't.

"I made a commitment when I married her, in sickness and health, so I couldn't cut her out like that."

Then six months later, Justin got a text from his wife. She had wrecked her car and was in the hospital. "It terrified me," Justin shares. "It's not the way I would've chosen, but I knew where she was, and she was forced to be in front of a doctor."

#### "Turns out she had heavy metal poisoning in her body. That's what had changed her mentality."

If you had time to hear all the details of the restoration of Justin's marriage, you'd be moved by his faithfulness to his wife and his humility before God. Praise God that his wife is healthy again and they're moving toward full reconciliation. There is more work ahead, but in his hour of need, God gave Justin caring neighbors like you to help him through.

"God has moved in my life during my time here," Justin shares. "I've realized His wisdom is not my wisdom; His timeframe isn't my timeframe. I don't like the things we've gone through, but if this is what had to happen to bring my wife and I together and to God, I accept that."

## This Thanksgiving, Justin recognizes that life isn't always perfect — but God is always there. He counts his blessings and keeps an eternal perspective.

"Gratitude has helped me keep my head above water," Justin adds. "I thank God every day for the people He's put in my life. This place helps broken people. I've watched men come in, and think, 'There's no way they're going to make it.' But God reaches into their heart and they start to grow." Justin is one of them.

"To the people who help keep this place going, thank God for you, and don't stop," Justin shares. "This place saves people."
