ASHLEE FINDS ACCOUNTABILITY AT OPEN HEART

"Open Heart has always opened their door to me," says Ashlee.

In fact, Ashlee has been to our Open Heart Women's Shelter three times. The first time, deep in addiction, she had recently lost her daughter to foster care. "I was just hopeless. I had nothing left in me."

After leaving Open Heart that first time, Ashlee struggled. She got into trouble with the law and ended up in drug court. But despite some setbacks, she eventually got clean and found a good, safe place to live.

And she had a strong motivation to stay sober: she was pregnant again and vowed to give this child the best start in life she could.

Sadly, Ashlee ran into more problems. "I did a month in jail and I lost my job. I wasn't able to catch up after I got out, and I lost everything I had worked so hard for," she recalls. "It sucked me down into a depression. I felt like I didn't care and I just wanted to give up."

But Ashlee didn't give up. She knew help waited for her and her baby at Open Heart.

"I knew going back to Open Heart was the best thing for me. I knew, where I was at in my life, if I'd gone anywhere else, I would have fallen back," she says.

"The last time I was there, I didn't see the purpose in it. Maybe I needed to venture



Ashlee stayed at Open Heart and took classes to help prepare her for being independent and caring for her baby. She was determined to stay as long as it took to give her child a better life than she'd had. "I grew up around nothing but drug addicts. My mom's been an addict my whole life. My dad was never there. I don't remember having a happy time as a kid."

The key to Ashlee's success at Open Heart this time around was keeping an open mind. "I used to not believe in God," she admits, "but I started going to church.

"And God told me, 'If you give everything to Me, I'll take care of it."

Ashlee's faith inspired her to reach out to other women at the shelter and encourage them on their journeys. "I noticed a lot of the girls coming in might not believe in God, and I would offer to take them to church with me. And if I see them doing something wrong, I try to help them out with being accountable."

Just days before Christmas, Ashlee gave birth to a daughter, Acaysia. And weeks later, Ashlee had another reason to celebrate: a whole year of sobriety!

Today, Ashlee is in a committed relationship, and she and her daughter are safe. "I'm really focusing on the purpose I have in life," she says.

Ashlee can look back on the rough road she traveled to get here, and offer some advice to those following in her footsteps at Open Heart. "You get a lot of accountability at the shelter, so you can get on your feet and do the things you need to do," she says.

"It may take some time to change, but change is here if you want it."


