"When I got to jail, I started doing Bible study and Sunday devotions. I really dedicated myself to believing in a higher power," Ronnie tells us. "Doors started opening up for me."

Ronnie entered the Moral Recognition
Program, part of the Grant County jail system.
It was a turning point for Ronnie. He became
a mentor to others in the program and made
a commitment to get back on a positive path.
Given his choice of options after leaving jail,
Ronnie chose to come to the Grant County
Rescue Mission.

"Instead of repeating the cycle,
I figured this place would give me a
good opportunity to learn from my past
and try to make things better."

Ronnie showed up at the Mission with an optimistic attitude and dedicated himself to making a lasting change in his life. On his first night, he says, "I felt welcome and at peace, compared to all the chaos in my old lifestyle. It was a whole new ballgame."

Since he arrived in April of this year, Ronnie has made great progress in our Life Change Program. He has grown closer to Jesus, building on the relationship he began while in jail. And he enjoys sharing his newfound peace with others in

the program.

"I try to create brotherhood," Ronnie says.
"I give the guys encouragement. They have to leave their past at the door. They have to let go of all that and move forward. I want to see everybody achieve, just like I did."

Today, as graduation approaches, Ronnie looks forward to spending time and sharing his faith with his four children and two grandchildren. "I can't really tell them what to do, but I can guide them," he says. "The more faith I gained, the more blessings that came. And it still continues. I'm a member of Lakeview Wesleyan and I got baptized. God is good, for sure!"

Ronnie also recognizes that God works through caring people like you.
