"I pretty much had a nervous breakdown," Rita says. "I started using drugs. I got arrested three times in one year for drugs and a couple of battery charges." Even through all her troubles, Rita knew she had to get back to the life she was meant to live. Given the choice between probation and drug court, Rita chose drug court and came to our Open Heart Women's Shelter.

"I wanted to get clean and get in right standing," Rita says.

It didn't take long for Rita to reach that goal. Just three weeks after she arrived at Open Heart, she was promoted to House Manager. "God opened the door for me to serve," she tells us.

But that wasn't the only door God opened. Since coming to Open Heart in January 2024, Rita got her old job back and bought a car. She gives her testimony whenever and wherever she can. She enjoys spending time with her grandchildren and looks forward to traveling again.

Rita believes restoration is available for anyone who is ready to change. "At Open Heart, you're safe, loved and cared for. They help you rebuild. They speak life into you. There's hope and life change here if you want it."
